Application Instructions

We look forward to reviewing your application for Master Brewers' recognition of your program in fermentation, brewing, or brewing and distilling sciences. If you are unable to complete any of the materials listed below, please submit a short explanation and provide any alternative documentation you think may assist us in our review.

Please Provide

- 1. Completed one-page application.
- 2. Evidence of adherence to Master Brewers Guidelines numbers 3–8 for your program (see attached documents for 4-year college-level degree or 2-year associate's degree versions).
- 3. The published curriculum and/or syllabus for each capstone class:
 - a. Evidence of method(s) used in this class to assess students' knowledge.
 - b. List of the learning outcomes for this class.
 - c. A summary statement explaining how this class is structured to meet its published learning outcomes.
 - d. Do your learning outcomes for this capstone class meet or exceed those provided in the Master Brewers guiding documents? Yes No
If no, please explain. Attach your learning outcomes, if available.
- 4. A summary statement (1–2 pages) on the scope of work appropriate for students completing this degree. Include examples of skill sets, both of what a student could and could not expect to attain, based solely on completion of this degree.
- 5. Other supporting materials:
 - a. A list of all classes that might contribute to the completion of this degree, other than the capstone courses described above. Include any prerequisites not already accounted for in other documentation.
 - b. Both the school's mission statement and the department's or program's mission statement, if available.
- 6. Provide with the full application, a reference list or bullet point index that correlates the questions in the application to the location(s) in the materials provided where support can be found, i.e. provide the page number(s) where this information is referenced in the materials.

A team of two reviewers from the Master Brewers Review Committee will be assigned to perform an initial audit of the submitted materials and will correspond directly with applicants thereafter to seek clarifying information as necessary.

If requested, we will also assign a Master Brewers member brewmaster, or equivalent, to act as an ambassador between the review board and the applicant program contact(s). This brewing professional will be available to answer or seek answers to questions, provide resources from industry that may be available to your program, and assist with successful completion of the application process.
